How do fiction writers craft stories to hold the reader's interest?

You will read a wide range of fiction extracts and develop your skills of analysing them accurately. You will also practice your Creative Writing skills under timed conditions.

How do writers approach social issues through drama?

You will study the play "An Inspector Calls" by J B Priestley, exploring character, plot and social context behind the author's intentions.

How does Dickens challenge the Victorian view of charity?

You will study the Charles Dickens novella "A Christmas Carol" and research the historical context of the story, including Dickens' use of the supernatural as metaphor

How do poets convey ideas about love and suffering,?

You will revisit the poems you read last year and use your critical skills to analyse them using inference and deduction to work out hidden meanings.

How do poets convey ideas about Power and nostalgia?

You will study a set of poems from different time periods to make thematic connections between them, and analyse the poets' use of language using textual evidence.

How does Shakespeare present the rise and fall of Macheth?

You will study the play "Macbeth "in detail, researching the nature of Tragedy as a genre, Shakespeare's use of the supernatural, and key elements of plot character and theme. You will write extended answers analysing specific areas of the play, exploring character, theme and structure, supported by textual evidence.

How do non fiction writers use language to persuade?

You will read a range of 19th and 21st Century texts, carefully examining author's intentions and how the writers use language to persuade, inform and entertain their readers. You will create your own transactional texts.
