Y10 ROADMAP - MUSIC

Subject Aim:

What is GCSE Music and how can I start to appraise, perform and compose with an understanding of the marking scheme?

Forms & Devices

You will learn new terminology for different musical structures and how these link with the musical elements and begin to write music in simple structures. We will perform in small groups different pieces of music.

Popular Music

In this unit, you will be looking key features of different styles of popular music, consider different chord progressions and write music using these.

Music for Ensemble

In this unit, you are considering different musical ensembles and different styles of music. You will compose using different textures and perform as an ensemble.

Film Music

In this unit you will be considering how elements of music are used in film music and compose a piece of your own film music.

Badinerie – Bach

In this unit you will be looking at the set work Badinerie. You will be learning about how the elements of music are used and specific key features of the music and learn new terminology. You will be beginning a composition to a brief.

Africa – Toto

You will be looking at the set work Africa. You will be learning about how the elements of music are used and specific key features of the music and learn new terminology. You will be completing your composition to a brief.

ASSESSMENT

- Every lesson will start with a listening task to develop your understanding of the elements of music.
- At the end of each unit you will perform your rehearsed piece and evaluate other groups.
- You will set yourself personal targets which will help guide you in your next unit.

INDEPENDENT LEARNING

- Personal practice outside of lessons is vital
- Knowledge Organisers are to be used to help your understanding of key words.
- Homework to understand your learning
