Unit 1: How is society divided?

You will be looking at the concept of stratification and how society is divided. You will also consider different sociological approaches as to whether inequality and stratification is necessary for society.

Unit 2: Does everyone have the same life chances?

In this unit you will look at how class, gender, ethnicity, disability and sexuality impact on a persons life chances. You will look at why some groups have positive life chances whilst others live in poverty. You will also consider how society is structured to perpetuate inequality.

Unit 3: What causes poverty?

In this short unit you will look at why some people are more likely to live in poverty and consider who is to blame for poverty in the UK.

Unit 4: Do we need crime?

This unit builds on your knowledge of sociological theories to look at whether or not society needs crime. You will consider how crime is socially constructed and what causes crime. You will also consider why some people are more likely to turn to crime in the first place.

Unit 5: How do we know about crime?

Here you will look at how the police and government collect data on crime and think about whether or not we can trust these statistics. You will also consider other ways we can research crime.

Unit 6: How do sociologists conduct research?

This short recap unit looks at the methods sociologists use to research society and the things they have to consider.

In the final term you will have the opportunity to undertake revision and exam practice

ASSESSMENT

- Most lessons will test your knowledge using a variety of activities including Knowledge Tests, retrieval activities and exam questions.
- For each unit, you will be given a mixture of short knowledge tests throughout and exam style questions at the end.
