

# Y12 ROADMAP – HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

**Subject Aim:** This course aims to offer an effective introduction to the health and social care sector. This qualification looks at the role the sector plays in the health, well-being and care of individuals.

<b>TERM 1</b>	<b>What is health and security in HSC environments? What factors can influence the building of relationships?</b>
	Unit 3 introduces health, safety and security in HSC. You will acquire the necessary knowledge and skills in maintaining a safe working environment for service providers and users. You will learn how legislation and policies reduce risks in HSC and the consequences of not following them. Unit 1 coursework explores the types of relationships and factors which can influence them.
<b>TERM 2</b>	<b>How does legislation keep HSC environment safe? How do we use effective communication?</b>
	Building on knowledge from last term in Unit 3, you will learn how respond to different incidents and emergencies with health and social care settings. In Unit 1 you will be demonstrating and reviewing effective communication across a range of coursework tasks.
<b>TERM 3</b>	<b>What is discriminatory practice in HSC?</b>
	You will sit your Unit 3 exam at the beginning of this term. You will also make any final improvements to your Unit 1 cwk portfolio. Following that, you will start Unit 2. We will be focusing on the different types of discrimination, and the effects, and examine various pieces of legislation set put to protect vulnerable groups.
<b>TERM 4</b>	<b>What key pieces of legislation promote anti-discriminatory practice?</b>
	We will be focusing on the different types of discrimination, and the effects, and examine various pieces of legislation set put to protect vulnerable groups. You will also review a range of real life case studies to discuss how to apply best practice and challenge discrimination.
<b>TERM 5</b>	<b>How can I get the most out of the exam series?</b>
	You will sit your Unit 2 exam during this term. This term will therefore focus on revision strategies to improve recall, as well as exam techniques and tips. There will also be an opportunity to resit Unit 3 following your result from the January series.
<b>TERM 6</b>	<b>What are the different systems in the body?</b>
	This term will see the start of Unit 4 Anatomy and Physiology. There are five main systems to learn. You will begin by learning about the control and regulatory systems in the body, mostly centred around the brain and how the functions of the cardiovascular system within the body. You will also consider the major cardiovascular malfunctions alongside the monitoring and treatment of them.



## ASSESSMENT

- Most lessons will test your knowledge using a variety of activities including Knowledge Tests, Q&A and exam questions.
- Each and every lesson will be punctuated by various hinge questions, statements and discussion opportunities.
- Unit 1 coursework will be assessed across Terms 1&2.
- Unit 3 examination will be in January and Unit 2 examination will be June.
- After successful moderation, you will start on the Y13 January exam for Unit 4.



## INDEPENDENT LEARNING

- Knowledge Organisers are expected to be used weekly to support the learning and recap of key vocabulary as the course progresses.
- Key information will be communicated to you via your MS Teams HSC Class which may include links to relevant articles, websites and video clips.
- There will be opportunities to practice crucial retrieval and revision skills with various resources and templates provided.
- For some of the lessons there will be flipped learning tasks to prepare for you the lesson content.
- You will need to manage your time effectively in order to meet deadlines. A list of deadlines will be made available to you to help with this.
