






# ThiNK Vision

At North Kesteven Academy we believe a secure understanding by all of our key behaviour principles is important. Ready, Respectful, Safe are the cornerstones of our philosophy on this at North Kesteven Academy. North Kesteven Academy is a comprehensive school for students aged 11-18. Students are in tutor groups with a tutor who is the first point of contact for parents and carers. # ThiNK Expert

At North Kesteven Academy, our curriculum encourages high ambition in a supportive and stimulating environment. By celebrating individuals' achievements, we enable everyone to be happy, responsible, respectful, creative and confident. Our curriculum encompasses the entire experience that our students encounter including assemblies, Personal Development Time, lessons and extra-curricular time.

## Principles

To ensure that every learner has a deeply rewarding educational experience, our curriculum is governed by six overriding principles; these are:

- Balanced
- Vertically-integrated
- Focused
- Coherent
- Rigorous
- Authentic

## Our Curriculum is ...

### **Balanced:**

We develop student knowledge across a generous breadth of academic, practical and creative subjects to develop students' curiosity, spark and broaden their interests.

### **Vertically-integrated:**

We ensure that every student has the requisite knowledge for the next step. Topics have been very carefully sequenced to ensure your child is ready to advance their understanding. We also structure the learning around carefully considered 'big questions' that are a part of a clear overriding 'story' and will challenge students to develop expert subject knowledge.

### **Focused:**

Opportunities for 'deep learning' make a real difference. We have thought carefully about the key questions that need to be explored and answered in depth to develop subject expertise.

### **Coherent:**

We find the opportunities when different subjects come together to shed new light upon each other.

### **Rigorous:**

We give students a vault of subject-specific knowledge and vocabulary and our curriculum explicitly values and develops vocabulary and places it at the heart of learning.

### **Authentic:**

Students will experience educational opportunities that feel relevant and authentic and help them to make connections, making it clear why what they are doing is relevant; it exposes them to a world beyond their world and makes it clear why it matters.

# ThiNK Extra-Curricular

Learning beyond the classroom is highly valuable and, for this reason, we expect our students to play a full role in the wider life of the school and community. Our extensive range of opportunities provides something for everyone with which to get involved. This enables students to develop friendships, to nurture talents or to learn a new skill.

Extra-curricular activities are on offer at lunchtimes and after school, with lots of variety available. The academy has an annual musical performance, involving all aspects of performing and creative arts. Other examples of clubs and activities include a choir, various dance groups, lots of sports teams, Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, Dungeons and Dragons club.

Trips and visits are integrated into our curriculum provision for each subject area. There is a plethora of opportunities to go on trips and visits. Examples of recent opportunities include a Maths visit to Market Rasen Racecourse, a Drama trip to London to watch West End shows, a Politics visit to the Houses of Parliament, Geography visits to the coast and an expedition to Borneo.





# ThiNK Facilities

At North Kesteven Academy we believe education is about balance. We encourage our young people to strive to be healthy in body and mind, so we try to place just as much emphasis on enjoying the arts and participating in sports as we do on academic attainment.

Our academy boasts superb sporting and arts facilities and our long association with OneNK gives students access to a 25m swimming pool with slide and separate splash pool. Our dance and fitness studios, gymnasium, all-weather sports pitches, and impressive playing fields all provide the perfect opportunity for students to get active and stay healthy.

For students who are inspired to tread the boards, the academy's collaboration with the well regarded Terry O'Toole Theatre offers access to a professional performance space, qualified technical staff and an exciting venue for academy events.

The theatre complements other performance facilities within the school, including a fully equipped drama studio and state of the art sound recording facilities. Perfect for budding musicians and actors to develop their skills.





### **Breaking the mould**

We believe that every student deserves the same opportunities and will work with each student and their family to ensure that we work together to enable all young people to access as many opportunities as possible.

Our careers and PSHE programmes are integral aspects of our curriculum and we believe that it is important for students to understand and demonstrate in all subjects the skills and qualities needed, not just to achieve in their examinations at the end of Year 11 and 13, but also to progress successfully to university and into employment.

## **How to apply for a place at North Kesteven Academy**

All admissions for places into Year 7 in September are processed by the Local Authority.

Applications are usually open from 1st September and close on 31st October.

Throughout the academic year we would be delighted to make arrangements for parents/carers and prospective students to visit us and experience at first hand the vibrant and engaging atmosphere.

We hold official open events in July, September, December and May including evening events and community occasions.

Years 4, 5 and 6 are often invited in with their primary schools to experience our academy and take part in specific subject activities. We have a full education programme for Year 6 students to support their transition from their primary school into our academy.

We're always happy, however, to welcome visitors for a tour of our academy at any time to suit your busy schedules.

Increasing numbers of parents are applying to us mid-year, either because they are moving into the local area or because they are dissatisfied with their current school.

Applications for mid-year admissions are also processed by the Local Authority.

# Our Houses...

**Our four houses drive the community spirit here at North Kesteven Academy**

The house system enables ways for students and staff to feel more connected to, and involved with, the academy. It facilitates discussions between all of our pupils in a vertical way and fosters a friendly competitive spirit along the way.

The house system at North Kesteven Academy is based upon four houses: Boole, Ruston, Swift and Tennyson, named after famous and influential people who originated from Lincolnshire. Every student and every member of staff belong to a house. Each house is run by two sixth form students, as Heads of House, who are appointed at the start of the summer term in Year 12 and are in post for one academic year. Within the houses each year group elects captains and vice captains who organise teams for events and monitor the participation of members of their house.

The programme of events is discussed and determined by the Heads of House who try to ensure balance and variety within the competition.

Houses gain points through our rewards system, with students having an opportunity to receive points in every lesson and also out of lesson.


